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



Methodology and Criteria for Exam Evaluation

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What are the C1 Level Skills?

Level C1 is the fifth of the six levels proposed in the CEFR, known as "effective operational proficiency", since it is the level at which one already has an advanced understanding and ability to express oneself in the language. Candidates accredited at this level can cope with a variety of situations, both everyday and specific, without the need for prior preparation and with a naturalness typical of those who effectively control the language.






Is able to understand a wide variety of long and demanding texts and recognize implicit meanings in them

Scope

Correction

 Consistently maintain a high degree of grammatical correctness; errors are rare, difficult to spot, and are usually corrected when they occur

Fluency

 Express yourself fluently and spontaneously with little effort. Only a conceptually difficult subject can hinder the natural flow of your expression

Interaction

- Choose appropriate phrases from an available range of discourse functions to introduce comments, in order to start speaking or continuing to speak
- Skilfully connect your own interventions to those of the other speakers

Coherence

 Produce clear, fluent and wellstructured speech, demonstrating controlled use of organizational structures, connectors and cohesive mechanisms

Listening comprehension objectives

The candidate is able to:

- Understand enough to follow a long speech on abstract and complex topics beyond their expertise, although they may have to confirm some details, especially if they are not accustomed to the accent
- Recognize a wide range of idiomatic and colloquial expressions, and notice changes in register
- Follow an extended speech even when it is not clearly structured, and when links are only assumed and not explicitly pointed out
- Easily follow complex conversations between third parties in group discussions, even on abstract, complex, and unfamiliar topics
- Understand with relative ease most lectures, discussions and debates
- Extract specific information from public statements that have poor quality and distorted sound; e.g., at a station, in a stadium, etc.
- Understand complex technical information, such as operating instructions, product specifications, and everyday services
- Understand a wide range of recorded and broadcast material, including some unusual usage, and identify details and subtleties such as implied attitudes and relationships between speakers





Reading comprehension objectives

The candidate is able to:

- Understand in detail long and complex texts, whether or not they relate to his or her specialty, provided he or she can reread difficult sections
- Understand any communication with sporadic use of the dictionary
- Understand in detail a wide range of lengthy and complex texts that you are likely to encounter in social, professional or academic life, and identify subtle details including both implicit and explicit attitudes and opinions
- Understand in detail lengthy and complex instructions on new machines or procedures, whether the instructions relate to your field of specialty or not, provided you can reread the difficult sections
- Understand films that use a considerable amount of slang or colloquial language and idiomatic expressions

- Deliver clear and detailed descriptions and presentations on complex topics, integrating other topics, developing concrete ideas and ending with an appropriate conclusion
- Perform clear and detailed descriptions of complex topics

- Deliver clear and well-structured presentations on a complex topic, expanding at some length and defending your points of view with complementary ideas, reasons and appropriate examples. Make good use of interjections, responding spontaneously and with little effort

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Features of the C1 English Exam

What does the TECH Global University test assess?

- The contents of the exams and the evaluation criteria will be those corresponding to the **CEFR descriptors**
- No published assignments or test materials will be used.
- The four skills (oral and written expression, oral and written comprehension) will be evaluated together or separately. Use of language tasks may also be included.
- All test tasks, with the possible exception of the use of language tasks, will be close
 to real-world tasks and the text materials will be authentic, as far as possible and
 according to the level tested. This will be the case from level C1 onwards

How long does the test last?

The exams, whatever the level, shall not be less than **170 minutes** and no longer than **225 minutes**.



3 How is the test carried out?

- The oral and written comprehension tests, as well as the written expression test, are conducted via computer.
- The speaking test consists of an interview, whenever possible, with two examiners and recorded.
- The written and oral expression tests, whenever possible, will be evaluated by two examiners according to the procedures established by TECH.

Candidates must obtain at least a 6 on each part of the exam in order to obtain a PASS grade.

If you do not pass all areas, you will not get your certificate but we will give you a detailed report of your skills in each area and competency.

What are the assessment criteria?

With regard to grades, TECH, following the recommendations, uses the following criteria:



Candidates who obtain at least 60% in each of the 4 parts of the exam will pass the exam. Based on the overall score, a grade will be awarded that will appear on the certificate issued by TECH, according to the following scale:



In the event that a candidate does not pass any of the 4 parts of the test, they must retake the entire exam.

Structure of the TECH C1 exam

It consists of 4 parts:

Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.

The total duration of the exam is 170 to 225 minutes, with the first three parts taking place one after the other (1st Listening, 2nd Writing, 3rd Reading). There will be a minimum of 20 minutes of rest between the first three parts and the 4th part (Speaking), which can be done on the same day, or on a different day, with a maximum limit of 7 days after the other block has been completed.

Listening (Duration 35-45 minutes)

Listening consists of 4 exercises, each of which is based on an audio recording that can be a monologue or a conversation between 2 or more people. Exercises include, multiple choice, sentence completion, completion of charts, graphs or diagrams, and short answers in one or two sentences. In this part of the exam, it should be noted that accents from any part of the world can be heard, which adds a substantial degree of difficulty.

Reading (Duration: 50-70 minutes)

It consists of 40 questions grouped in 3 sections. Each text is between one and two pages long and several questions are asked about it. The texts are actual excerpts from books, research articles, newspapers and scientific journals. The type of questions, as in the oral part, is highly varied: multiple answers, completing tables, graphs or diagrams, locating information in the text, indicating the writer's opinion, etc.

Writing (Duration: 70-90 minutes)

This part consists of two exercises, an essay between 200 and 350 words and another between 450 and 600 words. As a first draft a small report is usually requested on a piece of information provided to the examinee in any format (text, graph, table or diagram).

Regarding the 450-600 word essay, a piece of information is usually presented very briefly (a couple of lines), followed by a statement about it, and then the candidate is asked to explain whether they agree or disagree with the statement, briefly stating the necessary arguments. The second exercise accounts for two thirds of the "Writing" grade and the first exercise for one third.

Speaking (Duration: 20 minutes)

In this last part, a conversation is held with an examiner, and it is designed to be as realistic as possible. It is divided into 3 subsections. In the first, the candidate responds to personal, family and/or everyday questions. In the second, the candidate discusses a specific topic indicated by the examiner. In this case, the ability to produce a coherent and orderly discourse is valued. In the third and last one, both the examiner and the candidate have a conversation on a specific topic, where oral interaction and discussion skills are assessed. The entire speaking part is recorded for later review purposes.

04 Who Can Take the Exam?

Candidates for the Level C1 accreditation test may be members of the University Community, as well as nationals or foreigners (over 16 years of age) who wish to accredit their level of linguistic competence for academic, educational, professional or personal purposes. Assessment and Certification

Each part of the exam accounts for 25% of the total grade. Candidates must obtain a minimum grade of 6 to pass each part of the course.

- To obtain an overall PASS in the exam, all tests must be passed with an average greater than 6
- To obtain an overall grade of **GOOD** in the exam, you must pass all tests with a grade higher than 6, and obtain an average between 7 and 8.9
- To obtain the overall grade of **EXCELLENT** in the exam, you must pass all tests with a grade higher than 6, and obtain an average between 9 and 10
- Only those who have passed may request a certificate of aptitude issued by TECH

The level will be considered acquired if the final total score is greater than or equal to 60% of the total possible score. No average will be made if a minimum of 60% of the possible score is not reached in each of the evaluated skills. Certificates will only be issued if the level has been reached.









To obtain the certificate, a score equal to or higher than 6 must be obtained in each of the 4 sections of the exam"

Certification

After successfully passing the exam, the student will receive a certificate of recognition that guarantees their preparation and proficiency at this level of the CEFR.



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Instructions for the exam





Only candidates who have registered during the registration period and are on the official lists may sit for the examination.



It is compulsory to present a valid identification document or passport at the exam. No person without identification will be allowed access to the examination.



The language accreditation tests may be adapted to candidates with special needs. For this purpose, the type of disability (motor, visual, hearing, etc.) and the degree of disability, duly justified with a medical report, must be reported at the time of registration. Applications will be accepted depending on how far in advance the center is informed and the availability of resources at the center.
